In 2021 we were able to experience a more realistic BMX format of practices and racing. The season was of normal length and saw the return of a full calendar of District, Provincial and National Level events.

With that, we had a number of parent volunteers participate in Commissaire training. In 2021, Commissaire training was offered via Zoom for the first time, which allowed us to utilize training being offered and organized by Alberta BMX.

Practical training was carried out by both myself at Globe BMX and Kim Adam who facilitated practical sessions at Diamond BMX. Thank you Kim for stepping up to help in a very busy season!

This year, we saw the first provincial event being hosted in Regina by 13th Avenue BMX. There are now qualified Commissaires at each club, and everyone worked hard to share knowledge and process this year to try to create consistent experiences for racers and families. This is still a work in progress but all clubs made great strides towards consistent, fair and quality race Commissaire participation.

As the Chief Commissaire in SK, I was proud to say that I was able to attend every District and Provincial Series race in SK this year (a total of over 25+ races) as well, become a registered Challenge Class racer, participating in Nationals and Provincial Championships and taking home the N6 and SK2 plates in the 25+ Female Categories. After 6 years volunteering in many different capacities, it was exciting and both eye-opening to be on the other side of the clipboard and learn more about racing and rules from the athlete perspective. In order to participate as a racer at the Saskatchewan Provincial BMX Championships, Kim Adam acted as Chief Commissaire and I want to thank him for that opportunity.

I would like to take this moment to also thank both Kim & Lana Adam, as well as Janice Matus, who have continued to help both myself and other Commissaires/clubs grow in the Commissaire capacity and led the way for us for BMX in SK to be structured and successful and fair.

2022 will be an exciting year. As a Technical Committee, we have committed to better outlining the Commissaire path including documenting the practical and certification process in more detail.

- Ongoing advertising of the SCA through social media
- Identification of community partners across SK
- Development of the 'Kids of Mud' program

2022 is looking to be an exciting year with a close to normal race schedule. A significant amount of bikes were purchased through local bike shops over the past two years and the SCA has plans to reach out to new riders and gain exposure of our programs through pamphlets and QR codes displayed through the bike shops. In addition, the 'Kids of Mud' program will be rolled out in the spring for all

clubs to use in their learn to ride programs, including the development of women and adults. The committee is looking forward to the ongoing work for the 2022 calendar year.

Executive Director

I would like to thank all the volunteers of this Association; without your hard work this Association would falter. I hope that everyone uses this AGM as an opportunity to bring forward new ideas that our Committees can review and implement. The Executive Director is the staff liaison on all committees and a few highlights are listed but more details can be found in the Vice President's reports.

The 2021 year was still challenging. Our membership numbers were still down from pre-Covid, but up from 2020. We had a delayed start to our season, since there were restrictions until later in June. Thank you to all our clubs and race organizers for being able to modify any programming to include Covid restrictions and being able to operate in whatever way was made possible.

Finance

- The Audited Statements for the Year Ended December 31, 2021 are included in the AGM package. The Association did have a surplus of money, which was due to still not operating under normal conditions.
- Sask Sport continues to be the SCA's major sponsor by providing Annual Funding from the Trust. The Trust funds are derived from lotteries. The SCA is fortunate to receive this funding and thanks Sask Sport for their continued assistance and guidance.

Administration

- A reminder to the club presidents, the SCA programs are listed on the SCA's website under the club president's page <https://saskcycling.ca/clubs/club-president-info/>. Additionally under the insurance page <https://saskcycling.ca/buy-a-membership/insurance/> is information on the SCA insurance program, as well as Gallagher Insurance has a webpage set up with the national program insurance info. If there is an accident, please let your members know they can find out how to contact the insurance broker from that page, but they must do so within 30 days of the accident.
- The SCA has a Facebook page; everyone is encouraged to "like" the SCA to receive updates. Facebook for both GASP and the SCA have taken the place of the Cycling Shorts e-mail for the most part.

Horizon 100 Cycling

1. Briefly describe any activities/events the club conducted last year. Include weekly activities as well as special events.

Horizon 100 held weekly rides on Saturdays and Wednesday evenings during the 2021 riding season. We also ran Tuesday Night Training (TNT) rides on Tuesday evenings that provided members an opportunity to ride together for interval training. Half way through the season, we added Monday evening Lite Rides to support newer members and those wanting a shorter ride.

We ran 2 special events during the 2021 season.

- On Sunday June 27th the club held a ride to the Petrofka Bridge & Orchard. The main ride start was in Martensville, but many riders rode from Saskatoon to complete a 160km/100mile ride. This ride was held as a “Farewell Brenda and Ayoub Ride” to celebrate 2 very active members who were moving to BC.
- The Founders’ Ride was held on Sunday September 12th in Prince Albert National Park.

2. What did your club do to recruit new members? Were your plans successful?

Membership was lower during the 2021 season. We believe the uncertainty arising from COVID 19 was a key reason for lower membership.

To attract new members we placed an ad in the Saskatoon Leisure Guide. We also included Lite Rides to attract and accommodate new members.

For the 2022 Horizon 100 cycling season we are planning to return to a larger suite of regular rides, including:

- Saturday rides
- Monday lite ride
- Tuesday TNT
- Wednesday ride
- Friday FOGG

We are also planning to hold Thursday evening gravel rides once a month.

As COVID restrictions are being reduced, we are scheduling social events starting with a Pizza Night in May.

Special event rides are planned including:

- Midnight Howler Night Ride held around the summer solstice (June)

- Harvest Century ride which includes a 100km and 100 mile option (Sept)
- Founders' Ride in Prince Albert National Park (Sept)

Club Annual General Meeting Report Form/Questionnaire – 2022

PCDI

1. Briefly describe any activities/events the club conducted last year. Include weekly activities as well as special events.

PCDI held 2 main events in 2021, the Saskatoon Short Track MTB Series and the PCDI Ride the Ridge provincial MTB race. Short Track grew to 45 participants for the series held throughout June and July, and the provincial MTB race had over 80 registrants including participants in the kids race. Additionally, PCDI set-up and monitored a bike rodeo/kids cycle challenge in Aberdeen, and supported the Performance Cycling Program during the 2020/21 indoor winter cycling season.

Unfortunately PCDI did have to cancel the provincial series Cyclocross race in 2021 due to the Delta wave of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. We hope to bring provincial cyclocross racing out to River Ridge Trails in 2022 and beyond.

2. What did your club do to recruit new members? Were your plans successful?

PCDI primarily works to offer youth cycling programs to get kids and families involved with the organized sport from an early age. Expansion of the Short Track program for participants 3-12 years old was highly successful in 2021. Messaging was most effective over social media and from word of mouth from previous year's participants.

In 2021 PCDI also hosted its first provincial series race. Which this was not intended to drive PCDI memberships, we believe that having a robust provincial race calendar is important for general promotion of the sport, and helps to drive race license purchases for the SCA.

3. Briefly describe your club's plans for next year.

Currently, PCDI has plans to host, and expand, the Saskatoon Short Track MTB Series again in 2022. Additionally, PCDI is hosting another provincial MTB race, and is scheduled to host a cyclocross race in the fall too. With the recent posting of the provincial calendar, we are also now working with stakeholders to see what other events may be possible this year, hoping to fill some visible gaps in the calendar.

There were some communication gaps in 2021 which could be improved upon. Better communication with event organizers and other stakeholders would be very valuable. These communication gaps were likely amplified by the ever-changing operating environment created by the COVID-19 pandemic, so we look forward to seeing operations in a more “normal” year.

6. What would you like to see the SCA do in the future?

We would like to see the SCA work closer with stakeholders to understand what supports stakeholders need to be able to grow the sport and their program offerings.
